

Blackjack Shootout

Rules and course of fire

- 1- There will be 2 classes of rifles, Sport class and Custom Class.
Sport class is any rifle that is a stock factory rifle, (ie), Remington, Savage, Winchester, etc.
Custom class will be any rifle that has been custom built, with
An aftermarket barrel, custom action, etc.
- 2- There will be 2 sets of plates, a red frame and blue frame with 6 targets each. Plate sizes will be 12", 10", 8", 6", 4", and 2" for custom rifles, and 12", 10", 8", 6", 4", and 4" for the sport rifles. If anyone shooting in sport category wants to shoot at the plates with the 2 inch plate, they have that option. Custom rifles are required to shoot the frame with the 2" plate.
- 3- Each shooter will have 3 minutes to shoot 12 rounds at the plates for score and time. The 12" plate is 1 point, 10" is 2 pts, 8" is 3 pts, 6" is 4 pts, 4" is 5pts and the 2" plate is 6 pts. The last 4 inch plate is worth 6 pts on the sport target. The points total 21 ie; blackjack. The plates have to be shot in order, beginning with the 12" plate. Once the plate is hit, the shooter can move on to the next. If the shooter hits the last plate and has ammunition left, out of the 12 rounds, they can shoot the small plate for extra points until the 3 minute clock runs out. Each hit on the small plate is worth 21 points.
In the event of a tie between 2 or more shooters, there will be a shoot-off to determine the winner. The course of fire is points and time, ie; if shooters have the same score, but one shooters time is less than the other, that shooter wins.
- 4- There will be a safety meeting before the match, and afterwards shooters will draw numbered chips to see where they will be in the order of shooters. When shooter number one is shooting, the next shooter in order needs to bring his equipment to the line and be ready when it is his turn. It is the shooters responsibility to know when he is next to shoot. There will be 2 benches and 2 mats set up on the berm for each target frame, and there will be enough space between them as to not interfere with the person shooting.
- 5- **Safety note: When a firearm is being moved anywhere to and from the firing line, it is to have the bolt removed from the rifle or an empty chamber indicator installed in the action, with the muzzle pointed straight up. DO NOT bring rifles from the vehicle with the bolt in the rifle or semi autos without an empty chamber indicator installed.**
